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“Boomer & Carton” radio personality Craig Carton joins NJCTS leadership as an honorary board member

Carton is best known for his work at popular New York sports talk radio station WFAN alongside Boomer Esiason on the “Boomer & Carton” radio show, which airs from 6 to 10 a.m. Mondays through Fridays and is simulcast on the Madison Square Garden television network. Carton, 44, who was diagnosed with Tourette Syndrome in his teens, is a longtime supporter of NJCTS.

"This amazing organization leads the nation in providing services for kids and families, outreach to the medical and education communities and collaborative research into causes and treatment for TS. NJCTS Executive Director Faith W. Rice says Carton has an unquestioned desire for helping the 1 in 100 kids who shows signs of Tourette Syndrome – a misunderstood, misdiagnosed, inherited neurological disorder characterized by vocal sounds and motor movements known as tics.
